2. Co-curricular Activities

Additionally, the NSS Unit held a rally and submitted a memorandum to SDM Kumarsain concerning waste disposal in Kumarsain Town. Furthermore, the R&R Unit visited the Nasha Mukti Kendra at Matyana as part of the Nischaya Project.

Actions for next Academic Session:-

I) Enhancing Academic Support

→ With the new campus of the college ready, we are hopeful to move there soon. Currently, in the temporary sheds, we are unable to effectively integrate technology into our

education. However we are optimistic that in the upcoming session, we will be able to enhance our educational offerings through the use of technology.

→ In our college, students currently have limited subject options. In the upcoming session, we plan to reach out to higher authorities to request the addition of more subjects, including Economics, Physical Education and Geography.

II) Expanding Co-curricular Opportunities:-

→ In the new campus, we will introduce several new clubs including a Photography Club and a Book Readers Club. The Photography Club will provide students with opportunities to explore their creativity, learn photography techniques and participate in exhibitions. Meanwhile, the Book Readers Club will encourage a love for reading by discussions around various genres, hosting author talks and organising book reviews. These clubs aim to enhance student engagement, promote collaborations and support personal development in a vibrant campus environment.

III) Promoting Extra-curricular Engagement:-

In the 2024-25 session, as we transition to the new campus with ample space, the college will offer students increased opportunities in cultural and sports activities. The college will actively encourage participation in inter-college sports and cultural events and will also provide

facilities for both indoor and outdoor games.
