

An Overview

Situated in the lap of the scenic mountain town of Narkanda, Kumarsain the erstwhile capital of princely state of Kumharsain under the British Raj is about 80 Km. from the capital of Himachal Pradesh-Shimla. Kumarsain is famous for its religious and cultural heritage and lies one Km beside National Highway-05 from Bharara Village which is 20 Km from Narkanda towards Rampur Bushahr. Kumarsain is surrounded by scenic apple and cherry orchards for all sides. At the highest point of town, near the Kaali Mata Mandir at Digadhar', is situated the temple of learning, the Government Degree College, Kumarsain.

The college was established in 2014, vide Notification No. EDN-A-Ka (1)/2014 dt. 15-1-2014 of the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Himachal Pradesh as a co-educational institution. The first academic session commenced in the year 2014 with admission to the B.A and B.Com first year of the three year degree course. In the last session 2023-24, the college had 145 students on its rolls. The college started functioning in the building and premises of the department of horticulture, just below the new campus. The college was run temporarily in the tin sheds erected from time to time as per requirement, need and strength of students. The present building and related infrastructure came up after completion in 2024 and for the academic session 2024-25, the college has been shifted from the old premises to the new complex which has ample space to cater to the needs of academic and non-academic nature related to the student's faculty and administration. Now, the college has adequate number of class-rooms, two smart classroom, one common room for girls, NSS & Rovers and Ranger room, a well-stocked college library, a big reading room. The focus at new campus will be on all-round development of its students laying immense emphasis on sports and extra-curricular activities subjects like Geography, Economics, Physical Education and Public Administration shall be introduced, as soon as the approval of the Government is received.

Govt. College Kumarsain has now completed one decade of its existence. This institute has been a great boon for the weaker section of the society who cannot afford to move out of Kumarsain to complete college education. This institute of higher learning focuses on shaping the local energetic youth into educated, learned and responsible citizen by imparting quality education with the sincere and constant efforts of its dedicated teachers.

General Admission Rules

- Admission will be made on the recommendation of admission committee.
- Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility conditions.
- A candidate seeking admission has to be present at the time of admission and should be accompanied by his/her parents/guardian.
- A candidate must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
- A candidate having a gap of one or more years in their studies will have to submit an affidavit/ self-declaration explaining the reasons.
- Girl students seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of HP Bonafide certificate to avail them of fee concession (tuition fee only).
- Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach an attested copy 40% disability certificate.
- Those candidates who have passed their 10+2 examination from other than Himachal Pradesh Board of School Education must produce migration certificates in original.
- If the student gets admission by furnishing incorrect information or by concealing the facts, his/her admission will be cancelled on detection of such fault by the College/ University.
- In spite of the eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during previous years.
- The Principal reserves the right to reject or cancel the admission of any student without assigning any reason(s) or explanations if situation warrants so.

Admission Procedure

- Students can get the Brochure–cum–application form/prospectus from college office after paying the fixed price.
- Every candidate seeking admission to any class has to apply on the prescribed form available in the college prospectus.
- The application form is to be filled up neatly by the applicant in his/her own handwriting carefully after reading all rules, eligibility conditions.
- It is mandatory for all the applicant to bring his/her mother/father/guardian with him/ her at the time of admission. (Guardian means only blood relation). He/ She should not be a student of this college. No students of this college should sign in the place of parent/ guardian of any applicant otherwise none of the two will be admitted in the college.)
- The sequence in which certificates are to be attached is given in the admission form.
- Entrant himself/herself will have to appear before the admission committee with the original documents for admission and that admission will be done on the recommendation of the authorized admission committee.
- No such candidate will be admitted to the college whose conduct is not found satisfactory in previous year.
- The student, who is rusticated or expelled will not be given admission in any recognized college without the permission of the vice–chancellor.
- In the end, the form will be presented to the admission committee for verification and approval and finally before the Principal.

Eligibility for Admission to B.A. and B.Com.-Ist Year

- ✓ Only those students will be considered for admission to B.A. and B.Com. who have passed 10+2 examination.
- ✓ No admission will be allowed to the students with compartment at 10+2 level as per the decision of the Hon'ble High Court of Himachal Pradesh.
- ✓ Candidates must have secured minimum 33% at 10+2 level to get admission to B.A. course
- ✓ Candidate must have secured minimum 45% at 10+2 level to get admission to B.Com. Course. In case of girls students only 40% marks is required and students belonging SC/ST category with 40% at the 10+2 level are eligible for the admission to B.Com. course.
- ✓ Those candidates who haven't studied Commerce subjects at 10+2 level and still want to seek admission to B.Com. Course, In that case only those students who have studied Mathematics/ Economics as compulsory subjects with 45% will be considered for the admission to B.Com.

Age Limit and Relaxation

- ✓ Upper age limit for admission to B.A., B.Com. is 23 for Boys and 25 for Girls as on 1st July, 2025.
- ✓ Age relaxation of 3 years is allowed for SC/ST candidates.
- ✓ The Vice- Chancellor, HPU may, in exceptional cases/ Circumstances (to be recorded in writing) give relaxation in age up to a maximum of six months to any candidate. All such cases of age relaxation of up to six months may be granted admission provisionally by the Principal and a consolidate list of all such cases will be sent for approval of the Vice- Chancellor by 31st October of every academic year.
- ✓ Relaxation in upper age limit is also available to physically disabled candidates.

Required Documents

The completed admission form must be submitted along with the following documents:-

- Matriculation certificate for verification of Date of Birth.
- 10+2 Mark Sheet
- Two copies of passport size photographs.
- Character certificate in original from the Head of the Institution last attended or a character certificate issued by SDM/ Executive Magistrate in the case of private candidates.
- The Character certificate should have been issued within the last 6 months on the day of submission of admission form.
- Candidates who have passed +2 from Boards other than H.P. Board of school Education / ICSE/CBSE must submit equivalent eligibility certificate from H.P. Board/ University.
- Original Migration certificate from school Boards other than H.P. Board should also be submitted. Migration Certificate in original is to be enclosed with the H.P University enrolment form.
- Students of B.A./B.Com 1st year are required to attach one copy each of Matriculation & +2 certificate with the enrolment form.
- Certificate of SC/ST from Magistrate class I for those seeking relaxation in age/marks/fee concession.
- Any gap (latest) in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence/ affidavits as the proof of his/her activities during the period of gap. If the gap is 3 yrs or more the candidate will not be admitted.
- Certificate of Bonafide Himachali (for girl's students who belongs to H.P.)

Instructions for the Selection of Subjects In B.A. 1st Year

- 1) Every student have to study at least 8 subjects in B.A 1st year in which students have to select two DSC courses, two compulsory language courses and two ability enhancement compulsory courses (AECC).
- 2) Every student have to select two DSC courses and have to study two courses from each DSC out of the following subjects:-
 - ⇒ English
 - ⇒ Hindi
 - ⇒ History
 - ⇒ Political Science
 - ⇒ Sociology
 - ⇒ Music (V)

Note:- A student seeking admission in B.A. 1st year cannot choose two language courses as DSC.

- 3) The compulsory language courses for the B.A./B.Com 1st year will be English and Hindi.
- 4) The combination of AECC will be as follows:-
 - a. AECC I Environmental Science
 - b. AECC II English/ Hindi
- 5) The End term examination consonance with existing RUSA provisions i.e. 70% in theory and 30 % in CCA/IA for Arts and Commerce where practical are not involved. For determining CCA following procedure shall be applicable:-
 - i) 5 marks for attendance
 - ii) 5 marks for class test to be taken on completion of 40% syllabus by the class teacher.
 - iii) 10 marks for house test to be taken on completion of 75% of syllabus.
 - iv) 10 marks for assignments, tutorials, general behaviour of student.
- 6) The minimum passing marks will be 40% in aggregate. However 35% each in internal assessment and final examinations will be compulsory. A candidate failing in either one or two subjects will be given compartment in that subject and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. He/she will have to appear in the subjects got the compartment and there will be two chances for each (one at supplementary stage and other at annual stage.)
- 7) A candidate failing in three or more subjects will be treated as fail in that year and has to repeat the entire year.

Course of study and admission procedure under the new Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

Course of study and admission procedure under the new Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for student seeking admission to BA/B.Com. 1st year, 2nd Year and 3rd Year. From the academic session 2013-14 CBCS/ 2016-17 UGC CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) was introduced for the Under Graduate Degree course. Subject combinations have been offered according to availability of staff, courses and infrastructure. Presently, commerce and five courses of humanities viz. English, History, Political Science, Hindi, Sociology and Music (V) are running in the College. Norms and regulations for this system laid down by the H.P. University are given below:

Eligibility Criteria for Admission to BA/B Com Ist Year

- The student who have passed the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of the H.P. University.
- Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Arts /Humanities stream shall be given preference in admission to B.A. programme.
- Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. programme.

Condition for Completion of Degree

For the degree (B.A. /B.Com.) the student will have to cumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of coursework over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission provided that not more than three attempts will be allowed to pass a course.

Time Duration (Time Frame)

The UG (TDC) Programme for a regular student shall be for a minimum period of three year and a maximum of five years from the date of admission of the candidate.

Credits

The meaning of 'credit' is the weightage given to a course, usually in term of the number of instructional hours per week assigned to it. This explains why usually 'credit' is taken to mean 'Credit hours'. These credits also determine the volume of course contents and delivery of programme such as lectures, tutorials, practical's assignments etc. For the purpose of credit determination, instruction is divided into three components:

Lecturers(L) Classroom lectures of one hour duration

Tutorials(T) Special elaborate instruction on specific topics(from Lectures) of one hour duration.

Practicals (P) Laboratory of field exercise in which the students have to do experiments or other practicals work of two hour duration.

Each one of these components is considered as equal to one credit. One lecture(L) as well as on tutorial(T) of one hour a week is considered as one credit, whereas one Practical(P) of two hours a week is considered as one credit. The total weightage given to a course in term of credits will be equal to L+T+P, where L is the number of two hour Practical's per week. This can be written in symbols as:-

$$C=L+T+P$$

Where, C is the credit weightage for a particular course.

The total minimum credits required for an under graduate degree programme is one hundred thirty two (132) for 1st year to IIIrd year.

Courses in Programmes

Outlines of Choice Based Credit System:

Core Course (14 for honours courses; 4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com): The papers under this category are going to be taught uniformly across all universities with 30% deviation proposed in the draft. The purpose of fixing core papers is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution/university adheres to common minimum standard. Also the course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course (4 for honors courses and 2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

Dissertation/Project: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

Generic Elective (GE) Course (4 for honors courses and 2 each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement; i. Environmental Science and ii.

English/Hindi/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (minimum 2 for honors courses and 4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

Practical/tutorials (One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective paper): The list of practical provided is suggestive in nature and each university has the freedom to add/subtract/edit practical from the list depending on their faculty and infrastructure available. Addition will however be of similar nature.

Rules Regarding the Payment of Fee

- The fee/ fund structure is as approved by the Government/University and is subject to changes as per notification issued by Govt. /University from time to time.
- No tuition fee is charged from the Bonafide Himachali girl students.
- Students having more than 40% disability are also exempted from tuition fee.
- The PTA fund contribution from students for the session 2025-26 will be decided in the PTA meeting.
- Every student must pay his/her dues on the dates notified from time to time.
- A student will have to pay dues for six months at the time of admission and for the next six months in the month of November.
- Failure to pay dues on due date will entail a fine of Re.1/- per day.
- In case of non-payment of dues in advance, the name of student will be struck off from the college rolls at the end of the month.
- Every student will have to produce no dues certificate from the fee clerks if he/she wants to leave the college.
- The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of leaving the college.

Miscellaneous Information

Re-Admission

- Re-admission of Student whose name are struck off, the name of the students who absent themselves for ten days continuously from any class without proper leave shall be struck off the college roles. However, the Principal in his/her discretion may re-admit such students on payment of the re-admission fee along with a fine (to be decided by the Principal).
- The student whose name is struck off the college roles due to shortage of attendance shall have to seek re-admission within four days of the name being struck off, failing which he/ she will not be eligible for re-admission. Parent/ Guardian of the candidate must accompany such candidates. They will assume responsibility for the student's regularity in classes in the remaining period of the academic session.
- Any Student whose name is struck off for the second time in a year will not be eligible for re-admission accepts in exceptional circumstances.

Migration

- Migration from other college to Government College, Kumarsain and vice-versa is governed by H.P. University rules.
- No migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with the University. A migration student will not be admitted to the college if the subject/courses studied by him/her previously are not being taught by the college.
- After migration has been sanctioned and notified by the H. P. University, the student must join the second college within the time period stipulated by the University.
- The college first joined is entitled to the tuition fee for the month in which the University sanctions the migration. The second college is not entitled to the tuition fee for that month or part of thereof.

Leave Rules

A student can proceed on leave with prior permission from the subject teachers but the application should be signed by his/her parent or guardian.

- > A teacher can sanction leave up to 4 days while leave for more than 5 days will be sanctioned by the committee constituted for the purpose. Leave application must be submitted in the office.
- > Leave on account of illness, if it more than 4 days, must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate/Registration slip.
- > Students, who participate in various inter-college games or other competition, will have to get their leave sanctioned and noted by the concerned subject teachers before their departure for participation. No exemption/leave will be granted during Mid term tests.

Identity Card

- > Student must procure blank Identity card from College Office immediately after admission. Duly filled in Identity card must be signed by Tutor and Principal.
- > Identity Card is the most important document of a college student as it establishes his /her identity as a college student.
- > A student without an Identity card is deemed as an outsider.
- > A student is not permitted to replace his/her photograph on the identity card due to any reason whatsoever.

Notice Board

All the students must read the notices which are pasted on the College Notice Board on regular basis to keep abreast of the latest developments in the college.

Co- Curricular Activities

The college organizes various co-curricular activities to widen the mental horizons of the students and to provide opportunities for the development of their potential to the fullest through different clubs and society like the subject societies, Eco- Club, NSS. These Clubs/societies organize talks, debates, quiz contests and prepare the students to participate in interclass and inter college competitions like the HPU youth festivals, they are also encourage to celebrate occasions of national importance and cultural significance.

Note: Functions of societies will be organized after 1:30 p.m. On the day of functions all periods will be shortened by five minutes.

Classes will continue as per the time table. Only the members of the concerned club may be exempted for making arrangements

College Magazine

The college in this session will brings out the yearly issue of Magazine. Students, having a flair for writing, may submit their articles within the specified date for inclusion in the said magazine. The magazine consists of four parts, i.e. English Section, Hindi Section, Planning Section and Pahari Section.

Career Counseling

A career guidance and counseling cell is operative in the college under the direct guidance and supervision of the college principal. The cell comprises a core committee and stream wise sub-committees. The main object of the cell is to guide the students about the different career prospects and inform them about the more popular and accessible job inlets in the administrative and professional arenas. Career counseling seminars are organized on a regular basis to inform and encourage students to opt for regular as well as upcoming avenues for their prospective careers.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The college has NSS working under Dr. Ashish Kumar Chauhan. The NSS volunteers work towards community development, social welfare, social awareness and national integration works.

Annual Prize Distribution

Prizes are awarded at the annual Prize Distribution Function for obtaining First and Second position in the aggregate and also for obtaining first and second position in the individual subjects in the End Term Examination as well as Mid Term Tests provided a student has:

- > Passed in all the subjects offered
 - > Obtained a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate and in the subject in which the prize is claimed.
- Apart from academic prizes, outstanding per standing performers in sports, NSS and cultural activities (if any) are also facilitated.

Parent Teacher's Association (PTA)

The Parent Teacher's Association plans and undertakes development work in the college. The PTA is run by the Executive Committee which is empowered to take all the decision. Executive committee of PTA comprising:

- > Parents or guardians (only those who have blood-relation with the student studying in the college).
- > Teachers.
- > The Principal of the College will be the patron of the body.

Women Grievances Redressal Cell

This cell is especially established to take care of women grievances and their redressal.

College Students Central Association (CSCA)

The members of CSCA are elected as per the rules and regulation of H.P. University every year. The CSCA plays a pivotal role in organizing various, academic and co-curricular activities.

Conduct & Discipline

The Principal and the members of the teaching staff have the power to take disciplinary action against students indulging in reprehensible acts, which may lead to imposition of fine, suspension or expulsion from the college. Following acts come within the ambit of indiscipline and misconduct.

- Anybody found guilty of obscene writing on blackboards, wall or furniture.
- Any attempt to damage the furniture or other property in the campus.
- Bringing outsiders to the campus or sitting unnecessarily in the campus.
- Pasting any posters on the walls or notice board without Principal's permission.
- Every student must always carry with him/her duly completed identity card which is issued to him/her at the time of admission. He/ She must produce the Identity card whenever demanded by any teacher or the Principal.
- Parent/Guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the concerned teacher regarding the progress of their wards in the college.
- Warning: Smoking, chewing of tobacco/gutkha or taking drugs/alcohol etc. in and around the College Campus is strictly prohibited

Anti-Ragging Instruction

Ragging includes individual or collective acts or practices which involves physical or psychological assaults or use of forced restraint. Ragging exposes students to ridicule and contempt and affects their self-esteem. It is a heinous crime and is an insult to humanity. It entails verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior. It encourages enmity and hatred. The student's only purpose should be spreading happiness and creating a healthy and peaceful environment rather than encouraging hatred.

Prohibition of Ragging

- Ragging inside and outside the college campus is banned by law. So no student shall practice ragging in any form within or outside the premises of college.
- As per the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, ragging is a punishable offence.

- Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be expelled from the colleges and FIR to be registered against him/her and shall not be admitted in any other college/educational institution for a period of three years from the date of order of expulsion.

Note: In case of ragging of any of the student he/she may contact immediately the anti-ragging committee of college.

Ragging in and around the college/ hostel campus or on roads/ approaches leading thereto is strictly prohibited. If any student is found indulging in ragging directly or indirectly, the college authorities shall be obliged under rule 22.17 (a) (b) (c) of H.P. University to expel the guilty students from the college / hostel and to report the matter to the police as ragging amounts to a criminal offence as per the recent judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and Hon'ble H.P. High Court. A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years or shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs. 50,000 or both.

Note: Admission is open for all students on roll on basis, who are otherwise eligible without waiting for the final result. Roll on system means the student who has appeared in 1st Year and 2nd Year examination will go to the 2nd Year and 3rd Year as per the schedule without waiting for the result of the previous year. However, he/she will have to fulfill all the formalities laid down by the college authorities like filling up of the admission form if any, and depositing the prescribed fees.

There is no provision of admission as per University Ordinance after 30th June of every year and as per Himachal Pradesh Hon'ble High Court decision. No admission will be given after the notified Schedule.

We Expect Students to:

- ❖ Scribbling on the blackboard, walls and furniture is a part of indiscipline. A student found guilty of indulging in such an act will be fined or will be dealt with strict action.

- ❖ No spitting on the walls and the floor.
- ❖ Avoid any type of smoking/ chewing in the college.
- ❖ Students must possess his/her identity card in the college campus.
- ❖ Students are advised to see the notice board regularly for important information and notification.
- ❖ Damaging or sabotaging college property including desk, bench, chair, doors, windows etc. will be considered a punishable offence. When a student is found guilty of damaging college property, the respective cost will be recovered from him /her.
